Developmental Innovations and Open Learning for Empowering and Transforming Society: A Few Observations

All these requires clearly defined goals, interactive pedagogy, result based governance system and reliable parameters of assessment of performance. The Conference is an opportunity to ODL professionals too collectively reflect to bring more clarity to the developmental innovations in ODL and developing neo-institutional framework to realise the redefined goals of ODL. Hope the conference will throw more 'light' on the way forward and generate more 'fire' to ignite minds for transformation action.
