## ABOUT ADMISSION

### 1. Admission Procedure :

A learner may take admission in any academic programme at any study centre spread throughout the state of Assam provided that study centre offers the programme as desired by the learner.

(Refer to Page No 65 for the list of study centres)

For admission to a programme, course fee is to be paid through the Bank challan attached with the Prospectus or through SBI e-collect at any branch of State Bank of India. Application along with necessary enclosures and a copy of the challan returned by the Bank after payment, is required to be submitted at the recognised Study Centre within due date.

A summarised table indicating the eligibility criteria for admission to various academic programmes offered by the University is mentioned in page no. 10 to 12. For admission to any programme relevant documents are required to be submitted along with the admission form.

Intending learners with incomplete application may be given conditional admission at the University's discretion with the condition that required documents will have to be submitted on or before the dates prescribed for the purpose. Their enrollment (registration) will be confirmed only on fulfillment of the eligibility criteria. To appear in the examinations, confirmation of enrollment will be necessary.

All the enrolled learners will be provided with registration cum identity cards.

Those learners who are unable to complete the programme within the specified maximum period will be required to register themselves afresh by paying the requisite fee as per the University regulations.

The maximum duration of the different academic programmes offered by the University are as follows :

## 2. (A) Instruction to fill up the Admission Form (Offline)

1. Fill up the admission form along with the duplicate form provided in the prospectus.
2. Course fee to be paid through bank challan attached with the prospectus at any branch of SBI.
3. Application form along with necessary enclosures and a copy of the challan (returned by the bank after payment) is required to be submitted at the university's study centre within stipulated date of admission.

## 2. (B) (Optional) Online Application for Admission to Master Degree Programmes

Option for online admission has been introduced by KKHSOU. Please note that Online Admission is for the Master's Programmes only. Willing learners may apply for Online Admission through the web-site of the University: [www.kkhsou.in](http://www.kkhsou.in). The learners who choose for offline admission has to pay an additional cost of **Rs. 500** for the application form.

### The following are the requirements for online admission (for Master's Programme only)

1. Valid Email Account and Mobile Number
2. Internet Connection

#### The steps required for online admission are :

- Step1 : Create an Account at KKHSOU Online Admission portal (Link will be available in KKHSOU website [www.kkhsou.in](http://www.kkhsou.in))
- Step2 : Once you get the password in your email/ Mobile, login to the portal and fill up the details in the application form.
- Step3 : After completion of step2, the payment of fees may be made online by using SBI e-Collect or through the Challan. Take the print out of the application form and submit the same to study centre along with necessary documents.

A candidate unable to take admission in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester of a programme on or before the last date is required to pay a late fine of Rs. 200. The University's PAN required for payment of fee is **AAAJK1228Q**.

### 3. Major Course Information for BA Programme :

The learners, who desire to pursue major in BA should select any one of the elective courses they studied in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semesters. The learners should send the information of selecting major subject to the University through the Study centre.

A learner cannot opt for a major courses if he/she did not study it as an elective courses in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. In addition learners who wants to pursue major in any course need to study elective of respective course in 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Semesters.

If a learner wants to give up the major course after the result of the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester examination, he/she should write an application (forwarded by the Study Centre) addressed to the Registrar with a SBI challan of Rs. 300/-.

If a learner wants to give up the major course after the result of the 4<sup>th</sup> semester examination, he/she should write an application (forwarded by the Study Centre) addressed to the Registrar with a SBI challan of Rs. 500/-.

No request for subject change will be entertained after 4<sup>th</sup> semester for major course.

#### Subject Change in 1<sup>st</sup> semester after Admission :

A candidate enrolling for BA programme in KKHSOU is required to select his/her elective course after careful deliberation in 1<sup>st</sup> semester. If subsequently, a learner wants to change elective course in the 1<sup>st</sup> semester he/she should write an application (forwarded by the Study Centre) to the Registrar of the University.

The last date for course change after admission (if any) will be two months from the last date of admission.

For subject change a learner has to pay through SBI challan a sum of Rs. 500/- plus the cost of SLM (Rs. 75/- for undergraduate and graduate programmes; and Rs. 150/- for post-graduate programmes per booklet).



#### Course/Subject Change in Intermediate semesters :

If a learner wants to change an elective course during the intermediate semesters he/she should write an application (forwarded by the Study Centre) to the Registrar and the Controller of Examinations with a SBI Challan of Rs. 1000/- plus cost of the SLM (Rs. 75/- per booklet for , undergraduate and graduate programmes; and Rs. 150/- for post-graduate programmes) along with the original mark

sheets received. However, it is to be noted that any request for subject change will not be entertained after Second Semester.

The learners applying for subject change will have to appear in the examinations of changed elective course for 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> semester as an arrear (back) subject.

**Refusal/Cancellation of Admission :**

Notwithstanding anything contained in this prospectus, the university reserves the right to refuse/cancel admission of any individual on valid ground.

**Home Assignment :**

The Home Assignment for the learners are made available at the University website ([www.kkhsou.in](http://www.kkhsou.in)) just after admission to the respective semesters and in printed form along with SLM.

The learners are advised to write Home Assignments in their own handwriting and collect the receipt for the study center after submission. Learners are required to submit the home assignments one month before the examination in the respective study centres. Non-submission of assignments in time may cause the result of the particular candidate to be withheld.

**4. Continuous Admission**

After completion of a particular semester, a learner is required to apply for next semester simply by paying the necessary fees within one month of the last examination day of the previous semester. Admission in subsequent semester does not depend on the results of the earlier semester. One may take admission in the next semester even without appearing in previous semester examination. Admission should be taken continuously in all Degree, Diploma and Certificate programmes without any break. A learner will be allowed to appear in all the examinations including back papers within the stipulated time of a programme.

Learners are required to pay a fine of Rs. 300 if he or she applies for admission to the next semester after expiry of one month but within two months from the last day of examination of the previous semester.

On special consideration, a learner may be allowed to take admission in the next semester even beyond the two months but before the issue of notification of the examination of that semester by the University on valid grounds and on payment of a fine of Rs. 500.

A learner will, however, may be allowed to take admission even after that period without any fine, but he or she will be allowed to appear in examination of that semester in the next year only.



## SCHOOL OF STUDIES

With the approval of the Board of Management, the University established six Schools of Studies and one Institute of Research for the smooth conduct of its academic activities and research. The University endeavours to run all the academic activities of 19 departments under the purview of these 6 Schools named after some renowned personalities of Assam to commemorate their contributions to the greater Assamese society and culture.

### **Surya Kumar Bhuyan School of Social Sciences**

The School of Social Science has been named after the great historian of Assam Dr Surya Kumar Bhuyan. There are eight departments under this school which are -Economics, Education, History, Philosophy, Political Science, Sociology, Social Work and Teacher's Training. Besides, offering UG and PG programmes, these departments also provide diploma and certificate programmes.

### **Padmanath Gohainbaruah School of Humanities**

The School of Humanities has been named after the great litterateur and the first President of Axom Xahitya Xabha, Padmanath Gohainbaruah. There are mainly three departments under this school— Assamese, English and Sanskrit. However, under the Department of Assamese, Hindi, Bengali and Bodo have been included as Modern Indian Languages. The departments currently offer UG and PG programmes.

### **Maniram Dewan School of Management**

This School has been named after Maniram Dewan the great entrepreneur and pioneer of freedom struggle. Commerce and Management are the two departments under this school. These two departments currently offer a number of UG, PG and Diploma programmes in professional areas.

### **Bhupen Hazarika School of Mass Communication**

This School has been named after the great Assamese music maestro Dr. Bhupen Hazarika as a part of our sincere efforts to commemorate his contributions to the field of Journalism and Mass Communication. This school offers UG, PG and a number of Diploma programmes. The Multimedia Production Unit under this school has successfully produced various audio-visual materials for broadcasting and also for offering them as learning materials for the benefit of the learners of KKHSOU.

### **Guru Prasad Das School of Vocational Studies**

Guru Prasad Das has been hailed as a great entrepreneur and inventor. The school of Vocational Studies has been named after this little known great man. The departments under this school are— Agricultural Science, Electronics and Instrumentation, Currently, these departments offer Diploma and Certificate programmes on different vocational areas.

### Hiranya Chandra Bhuyan School of Science and Technology

This school has been named after the great scientist Professor Hiranya Kumar Bhuyan. Under this school, there are three departments– Computer Science, Mathematics and Library and Information Science. These three departments offer different academic programmes.

### Banikanta Kakati Research Institute

Research and Development is an important dimension of a University's academic pursuits. An academic organization remains incomplete in the absence of proper research activities. Keeping this in mind, all the research activities are brought under the purview of the Institute of Research which has been named after a great researcher of the region, Dr. Banikanta Kakati. Professor Abu Naser Sayed Ahmed is the Director of the said Institute.

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## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

As an aspiring applicant desiring to take admission into an academic programme offered by this University, it is expected that you thoroughly examine the eligibility criteria yourself. The following checklist will help you to screen your own eligibility for admission. It is necessary to check the eligibility criteria before filling up the application form. Documents mentioned under column 3 of the following table against each of the programmes must be enclosed with the application form, failing which the application shall be liable to be rejected.

## Examination

### Term - End Examination :

1. To be eligible to appear for the term-end examination in any course, the learners are required to fulfill the following conditions :
  - (i) They should have valid registration number.
  - (ii) They should have opted and pursued the prescribed course.
  - (iii) They should have submitted the required number of assignments within due dates before taking the examination.
  - (iv) They should have submitted the examination form in the prescribed time along with the requisite fees, if appearing for Back courses.
  - (v) They must collect the admit card.
2. The University conducts term-end examination once for Odd semesters and once for Even semesters in a year. The learner can take the examination only after the minimum period prescribed for the course of study.
3. Examination date schedule indicating the date and time of examination for each course is sent to all the study centres in advance; the same is also notified in the University website.



### Information on Consolidated Marksheet

The University has the provision of issuing Consolidated Marksheet to all the learners who have passed all the semester examinations of a Programme (for example, 6-semester of Bachelor Degree, 4-semester of Master's Degree and 6-semester for MCA). The Consolidated Marksheet will reflect the semester-wise score of the learner, and will be provided to all successful learners through the Study Centres. The learners need to pay the fee for consolidated marksheet at the time of admission in the final semester. There is also a provision for Transcript Marksheet against a prescribed fee and for the issue of which the University will take approximately three months time.

### Issue of Pass Certificate

When a learner applies for Provisional Pass Certificate after passing a particular programme, approximately 30 days are required for issuing the same. Application should be made in the prescribed format accompanied by a fee of Rs. 235/- (Rs. 200/- for Certificate + Rs. 35/ for postal charge).

Original Pass Certificate is not issued until the Convocation is held. One can apply for the original certificate to be awarded in the Convocation by paying the fee as prescribed, or can apply thereafter in the prescribed format accompanied by a fee of Rs. 535 (Rs. 500 for certificate + Rs. 35 for postal charge). Application for Provisional/ Original certificate must be submitted at the Office of the Registrar, KKHSOU along with all the necessary documents.

### Examination Form :

A regular learner is not required to fill up any examination form to appear in the term - end examination. However, a non-regular learner who wishes to appear in the examination of back/arrear course shall have to fill up the examination form. The examination form is to be sent to the Controller of Examinations along with the requisite fee within stipulated time through Study Centre.

### Examination Fee :

Learners are required to pay the total fee for a semester including the examination fee at the time of admission. A learner is also required to pay the fee for consolidated mark sheet at the time of admission in the final semester of the programme.

### Submission of Assignment :

- Assignments are a part of the teaching-learning process and are compulsory.
- Assignment responses are to be evaluated and feedback are required to be communicated to the learners by giving back the assignments with evaluators' comments. Such assignments are to be collected again by the Study Centre at the time of issuing admit cards and be stored in the study centre's office till the end of next semester, for verification by the University, failing which might lead to withheld of result.
- Assignments marks are to be sent to the Controller of Examinations as soon as the examination routines are published or uploaded in the website.
- The home assignment marks must be filled out of 20 (for full paper i.e. theory paper of 80 marks) and out of 10 (for half paper i.e. theory paper of 40 marks).

### Preparation of Dissertation in Master's Degree :

A learner has to prepare a dissertation under the guidance of a professionally qualified supervisor. The learner may take up a problem related to the subject and should develop instruments for collection and interpretation of data and preparation of research report. The length of the report may be between 60-70 pages. Detailed guideline is available in the website.

### Time Period of Dissertation:

Dissertation work has to start from 3<sup>rd</sup> semester and the final report has to be submitted within the first 3 months of the 4<sup>th</sup> semester. The topic of study, review of literature, research questions, objectives of study and method of data collection have to be decided and finalized by the learner in consultation with the guide during the first part of 3<sup>rd</sup> semester. Data collection should follow immediately. Further, during the 4<sup>th</sup> semester, the collected data has to be interpreted and analysed. The report has to be prepared and submitted within 3 months.

### Submission of Project Report/Dissertation

The learner has to prepare 3 (three) sets of Project Report/Dissertation at the time of submission. One set is to be sent to the University through the Study Centre; one set is to be submitted at the time of viva-voce examination and one set is to be kept with the learner to be submitted to the University whenever required.

## Results

### Withheld Results :

If the result of a learner is withheld, for clearance of withheld result, a learner has to apply to the Controller of Examinations (through study centre along with requisite documents) within 60 days from the date of declaration of the result. For information regarding requisite documents, the learner may contact the Coordinator of the Study Centre.

A learner will have to deposit a fine of 1000/- if request is made for declaration of withheld results after 60 days but before 90 days. After 90 days no request will be entertained and the result will be updated as failed.

### Back and Betterment Rules :

- (i) For clearing a programme, a minimum of 35% marks (which comprise the marks obtained from term-end examination and home assignments as indicated) have to be secured by a learner in each course. Maximum four attempts are allowed in each course to clear **Back** subject/course, if any.
- (ii) **Back in Aggregate** (for Master's Programme only): If a learner fails to get 45% marks in aggregate despite of getting pass marks in individual courses, the learner will not be eligible to get the Master's Degree. Such a learner will be allowed to appear in any number of Course(s) (Theory) part of the Programme in any Semester for improving his/her aggregate percentage. However, the learner will have to complete the course within the maximum duration prescribed by the University, for example, six years in case of Masters. Moreover, maximum four attempts in one course/paper is allowed.

- (iii) The learners pursuing Master's Degree shall be provided with the option of appearing for **Betterment**. Only one chance will be given to candidates for betterment in the immediate next examination. To appear for betterment, a candidate has to apply using specific betterment form which will be available in the website. Betterment chance can be availed of only for two courses in one Semester.

### HELPER FOR VISUALLY CHALLENGED/ DIFFERENTLY ABLE PERSON

A differently able learner, including visually challenged learner may take help of a helper to write the answers on his/her behalf. The procedure to engage helper are as follows :

The differently able learner must have a valid certificate issued by competent authority stating that the candidate is not in a position to write the answer by himself/herself.

Such learner have to apply to the Controller of Examinations well in advance before the examination, for permission.

The helper (the person engaged for writing answers on behalf of the differently able learner/visually challenged) must have lesser qualification. A certificate in this regard is required from a person like the Principal of the school/college or a Gazetted Officer.

The photograph and handwriting of the helper is to be attested by the Principal/Centre In-charge of Study Centre or a Gazetted Officer.

The Centre In-charge of the examination will arrange for allowing the helper on receiving proper written permission from the Controller of Examinations. The Centre Incharge will also certify on each day of examination that the helper is the same person allowed by the Controller of Examinations by verifying him/her with the photograph in the permission letter.

### G. Diploma in Elementary Education (D.El.Ed.) Programme :

KKHSOU was entrusted by the Government of Assam with the responsibility to train the untrained teachers with a Teacher Training Programme through the distance mode. Accordingly, the University developed the 'Diploma in Elementary Education' (D.El.Ed.) in ODL mode for the in-service teachers of the State, which was launched in 2012. This programme is the first of its kind in the North East Region of India. The curriculum and syllabi, designed and developed as per the National Curriculum Framework for Teacher Education, 2009 has the approval of National Council for Teacher Education (NCTE). The programme is of two year duration and the in-service teachers selected/nominated/deputed by the Government of Assam (through SSA Mission) are only eligible to undergo this training programme. The programme has a separate prospectus.



### H. Master of Business Administration (MBA)

The MBA programme is designed to introduce learners to the various areas of business such as, accounting, finance, marketing, human resources, operations management, etc. All the courses are compulsory upto 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. In 3<sup>rd</sup> semester, there will be two compulsory courses and four optional courses. In the 4<sup>th</sup> semester all the courses belongs to the speacialization chosen by the learner.

The MBA programme of KKHSOU is a two year Programme with 4 Semesters and 2400 marks. Each semester comprises 6 courses. Each course carries 100 marks. The learners will have to submit a project report on any of their chosen specialization in the 4<sup>th</sup> semester. The programme has a separate admissiion bulletin.

## Ph.D. and M. Phil. Programme

The Ph.D. and M.Phil. programmes will be conducted as per the following clauses :

### Eligibility criteria for admission to Ph. D. programme :

Candidate for admission to the Ph.D. programme must have a Master's degree or a professional degree declared equivalent to the Master's degree by the corresponding statutory regulatory body, with at least 55% marks in aggregate or its equivalent grade 'B' in the UGC 7-point scale (or a equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) or an equivalent degree from a foreign educational institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognized or authorized by an authority, established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing, accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions.

A relaxation of 5% marks, from 55% to 50%, or an equivalent relaxation of grade, may be allowed for those belonging to SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/differently-abled and other categories of candidates as per the decision of the UGC from time to time, or for those who had obtained their Master's degree prior to 19<sup>th</sup> September, 1991. The eligibility marks of 55% (or an equivalent grade in a point scale wherever grading system is followed) and the relaxation of 5% to the categories mentioned above are permissible based only on the qualifying marks without including the grace mark procedure.

Candidates possessing a degree considered equivalent to M.Phil. degree of an Indian Institutions, from a foreign education institution accredited by an Assessment and Accreditation Agency which is approved, recognised or authorised by an authority established or incorporated under a law in its home country or any other statutory authority in that country for the purpose of assessing, accrediting or assuring quality and standards of educational institutions, shall be eligible for admission to Ph.D. Programme.

### Application Form for Ph.D. and M.Phil. Programme :

For admission to the Ph. D. and M Phil. programmes, candidates shall apply in prescribed form of KKHSOU as available in the website.

### Duration of the Ph.D. programme :

Ph.D. programme shall be for a minimum duration of three years, including course work and a maximum of six years.

### Admission Procedure for Ph.D. :

Admission to the Ph.D. programme will be based on performance in the entrance test and viva. Shortlisted candidates of the written test will have to make a presentation of their synopsis of a research proposal (format to be notified later) before a panel of experts.

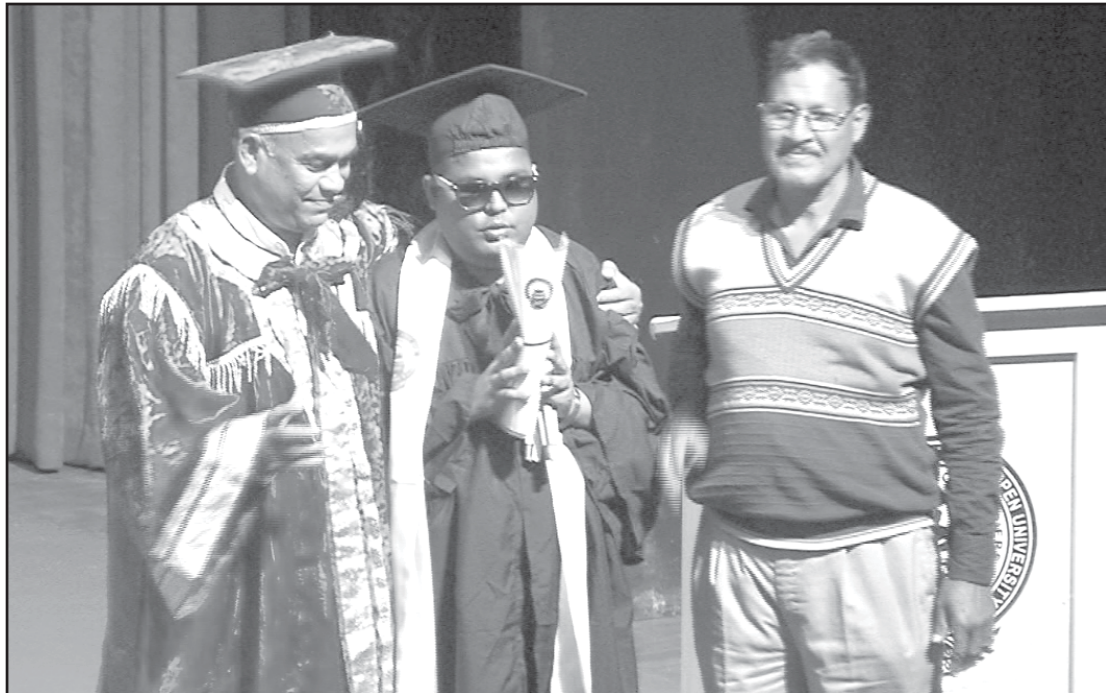

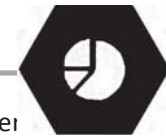
